

**CALL FOR  
NOMINATIONS OF CANDIDATES  
FOR HONORARY MEMBERS**

The IUAES is now accepting nominations for Honorary Members. Those selected and ratified will add to the current list, which can be found on the IUAES website at [https://www.iaaes.org/hon\\_members.html](https://www.iaaes.org/hon_members.html).

Nominations must be made in accordance with the [WAU Constitution](#) and [Operational Guidelines and Rules \(OGRs\)](#), which stipulate the following:

- a. Individual Honorary Members are professional anthropologists and/or ethnologists who have provided outstanding service and made contributions to scholarship in ways that have widely disseminated the insights of Anthropology/Ethnology and thereby contributed to WAU's aims and objectives.
- b. Nominations of candidates for appointment as Individual Honorary Members of WAU may be made by any Individual or Individual Honorary WAU Member but with the proviso that the nominee shall normally have had their place of professional employment in a country other than that where the nominator has been professionally employed or resides.

No candidate may be proposed without his or her prior approval, and no nominator can be related to the nominee by kinship or through a close professional connection. All nominations should be accompanied by a **short resume** and a **curriculum vitae** that includes the nominee's **bibliography**. In addition, the nominator should **submit a formal letter of nomination** addressed to the IUAES Secretary-General. This letter must explain the reasons why the nominee should be an honorary member of the IUAES by describing the nominee's merits and achievements.

In order to be considered for the approval by the General Assembly at the World Congress in Florianópolis, nominations must reach the IUAES Secretary-General, Junji Koizumi ([koizumi@hus.osaka-u.ac.jp](mailto:koizumi@hus.osaka-u.ac.jp)) by **Friday July 6, 2018**. One nominator may submit a proposal for only one nominee. While the nominators are limited to paid-up members of the IUAES, the nominees are not.

After a rigorous selection process, only some of the nominees will be accepted as IUAES Honorary Members. Recommendations of the candidates to the General Assembly will be made by the Executive Committee. Gender and regional balance will be important along with sub-disciplinary representation within anthropology and ethnology. The decision will be announced and ratified at the meeting of the General Assembly at the Florianópolis World Congress.
